ITINERARY

DAY 1

Flight from Rome FCO (15:00) to Delhi (2:00am). Transfer to the hotel.

DAY 2

After breakfast, leaving to Nawalgarh (255kms, 6hrs), in the Shekhawati region, founded by Thakur Nawal Singhji in 1737. First exploration of the city. Dinner and overnight.

DAY 3


Visit of Nawalgarh, that has the greatest number of haveli (houses with central backyard). Time to discover the town and its markets and to get in touch with genuine local people. Excursions in the close towns of Dundlod and Mukundgarh. Dinner and overnight

DAY 4


Leaving to Pushkar (212kms, 5,5hrs), holy city that counts over 500 temples. and place of pilgrimage around its lake. The most important temple is dedicated to Brahma. Dinner and overnight.

DAY 5

Leaving to Jaipur (148km, 3,5hrs), On the way, visit to Ajmer, important religious centre, a muslim enclave in a hindu region. Visit to the Adhai-din ka Jhonpra mosque and to the dargah of Main ud-Din Chisti. Before getting to Jaipur, visit to temples of Galta Ji (Monkey temple), wedged between two hills. Dinner and overnight in Jaipur.



ITINERARY



DAY 6

Excursion to the Amber fort (Jaipur) with elephant ride. Visit of the famous "pink city" (Hawa Mahal, Jantar Mantar e City palace) and a walk through the crowded bazaar. Dinner and overnight.

DAY 7

Transfer to Agra (242kms, 6hrs). Along the way, stop at the Chan Baori of Abhaneri, a famous well with stairs, and at the brownstone town of Fatehpur Sikri. Dinner and overnight in Agra.

DAY 8

In the early morning, visit of the Taj Mahal, the great mausoleum that the emperor Moghul Shah Jahan built in memory of his wife. Then, visit of the Red Fort, where the same emperor was imprisoned by his son, until his death. Visit of the mausoleum of Itmad-Ud-Daulah. Free time to walk through the city. Dinner and overnight.

DAY 9

Transfer to Delhi (220kms, 4,5hrs) with a stop at the Akbar mausoleum in Sikandra. Then, in Delhi, free time to walk through the city. Dinner and overnight.

DAY 10


Day dedicated to the visit of Delhi: the biggest mosque of India, Jama Masjid; the India Gate; the tomb of Humayun; Qutub Minar; Gurudwara Bangla Sahib, the biggest sikh temple of the capital. Two hours to wash and change at the hotel near the airport. Dinner and transfer to the airport.

DAY 11

Flight from Delhi (3:25am) to Rome FCO (8:50)
